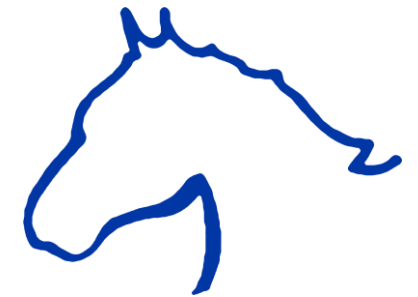

District Wide Building Condition Survey (BCS) Summary



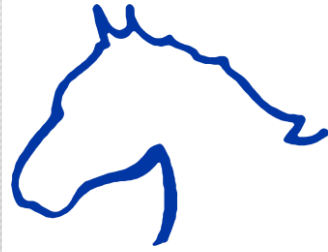
What a BCS is

- Requirement by State Education Department (SED) every 5 years
- District tool to secure Financial Aid
- Identify building elements that have outgrown their useful life
- Prioritize those items for a strategic replacement plan

What a BCS is NOT

- Educational planning tool
- Identify underutilized or over utilized spaces

Priority BCS Items - Elementary Schools



- Roof replacements
- Parking lot upgrades
- Door replacements for fire and safety upgrades

Priority BCS Items - Elementary Schools



- Toilet room and casework upgrades in classrooms to meet American Disabilities Act (ADA) Standards
- Upgrade and enlarge cafeteria and kitchen

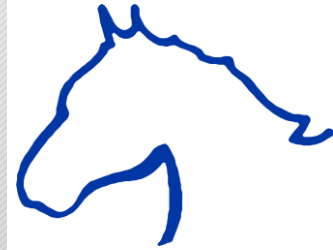

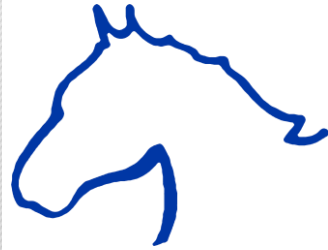

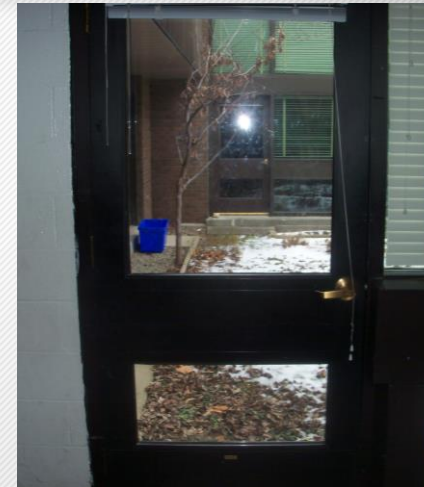

Priority BCS Items - MS/IS Campus



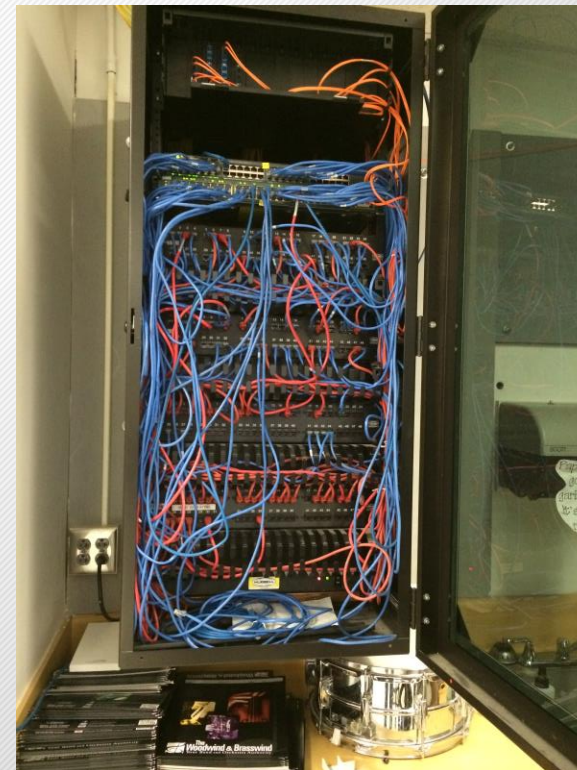
- Roof replacements

- Upgrade cafeteria and kitchen
- Upgrade gymnasium equipment
- Lighting and electrical panel upgrades
- Technology infrastructure upgrades



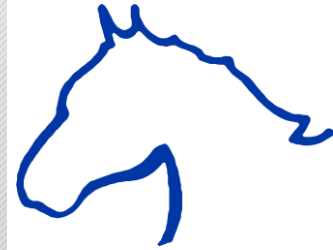
Priority BCS Items - High School



- Roof replacements
- Parking lot upgrades/site flow upgrades and improvements
- Door replacements for fire and safety upgrades
- Upgrades site facilities fields including property fencing
- Upgrade cafeteria and kitchen



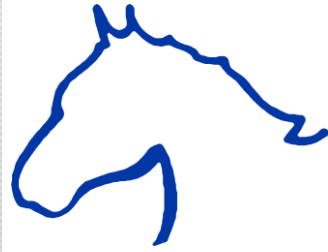
Priority BCS Items - High School



- Upgrade gymnasium/pool equipment and space
- Upgrade library shelving and finishes
- Upgrade mechanical systems
- Lighting and electrical panel upgrades
- Technology infrastructure upgrades



Principal and Administrative Meetings Elementary Schools



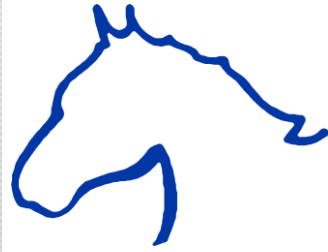
- Existing classrooms are undersized
- Lacking classroom space for K-4
- Lacking specialized spaces
 - Makerspace (Innovation)
 - Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics (STEM) space
 - Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) spaces
 - Fast Forward Program (Early intervention for language skills/reading readiness) Space
- Enlarged and updated kitchens and cafeterias
- Parent drop off vs. bus loop - better separation
- Public restrooms located closer to event space areas in the building
- General upgrade of finishes throughout the buildings

Principal and Administrative Meetings Middle/Intermediate Campus



- Improved security notification system for students and staff as well as visitors
- Lacking classroom spaces
- Enlarged and updated kitchens and cafeterias
- Improve use of library
- Lacking science classroom space
- Lacking a space the entire student body can come together in.
- Improve traffic flow
- Lacking specialized spaces
 - Makerspace (Innovation)
 - STEM space
 - Resource rooms / Academic Intervention Services (AIS) space / conference rooms

Principal and Administrative Meetings High School Campus



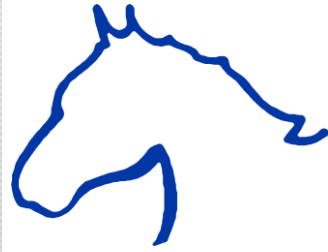
- Overall space in the classrooms is significantly undersized in some locations
- Nurse and main office locations need to be more centrally located
- Enlarged and updated kitchens and cafeterias
- Library space is sufficient but is outdated and needs upgrade
- Traffic flow for student pick up and drop off needs improved
- Student flow within the building is poor due to the disconnect from north to south wing, other than the link.
- Physical education is spread out throughout the building and would be better consolidated

2. January (2017) - Scope Development
 - a. Meetings with admin. staff
 - b. Board retreat
 - c. Staff meeting
3. February - Scope Development / Conceptual Design
 - a. Meetings with department chairs
 - b. Public meeting
 - c. Begin conceptual design

Projected Timeline



4. March - Scope Development / Conceptual Design
 - a. Meetings with admin. staff
 - b. Public meeting
 - c. Continue conceptual design
 - d. Prepare SED preliminary submission

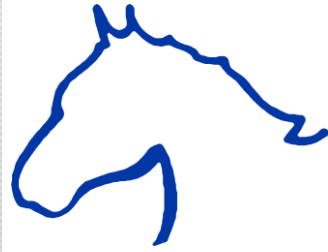
5. April - Scope Development / Conceptual Design
 - a. Meetings with admin. staff
 - b. Public meeting
 - c. Complete conceptual design
 - d. Complete SED preliminary submission

Projected Timeline



6. May - Finalize Scope
 - a. Meetings with admin. staff
 - b. Public meeting
 - c. Finalize scope and budget for June presentations
7. June -
 - a. Present complete scope, conceptual design and financials to the board of education
 - b. SED to complete the preliminary review
8. July -
 - a. Board finalizes scope and budget
 - b. Board declares intent to be the lead agency for State Education Quality Review (SEQR)
 - c. Begin public information program

Projected Timeline



9. August -
 - a. Board takes action on SEQR
 - b. Board adopts proposition resolutions
 - c. Continue public information program
10. September -
 - a. Continue public information program
11. October - Tentative Public Vote
 - a. Continue public information program
 - b. Public Referendum Vote
