# Center Street Information

#### **BUILDING DOORS WILL BE LOCKED**

As part of the district-wide security system and our emphasis on safety, the building doors will be locked during the day. Both of the main lobby entrance doors have a white box. Please push the button, wait for a response and you will be buzzed into the building. We may ask you to look toward the camera or identify yourself by speaking into the white box. Once you enter the building, please report directly to the office to sign in and pick up a visitor's badge.

<u>Visitors to the Schools</u> – to maintain a safe place for our children to work and learn, certain limits must be set for visits by parents and other agencies. For these reasons, the following rules apply to ALL visitors to the school.

Access to the elementary building will be through the <u>main entrance ONLY</u>. This entrance will be open for students and visitors from 7:45 - 2:25 PM.

ALL VISITORS ARE REQUIRED TO SIGN IN AT THE MAIN OFFICE IMMEDIATELY UPON ENTERING THE BUILDING TO RECEIVE A VISITOR'S PASS WHICH MUST BE WORN AT ALL TIMES WHILE IN THE SCHOOL OR ON THE SCHOOL GROUNDS.

Also, as parents arrive in the morning with children, please remain in the lobby area, children must learn to proceed to the room on their own.

Teachers are expected NOT to take class time to discuss individual matters with visitors.

Visitors attending school functions that are open to the public such as parent teacher organization (PTO) meetings or public gatherings are not required to register.

Any consumables (food, beverages, etc.) brought in by visitors are subject to search and / or inspection.

Please note these district rules are approved by the Horseheads Board of Education. These safety procedures need your support. If you have any questions regarding these procedures, please call the office. Thank you in advance for your help and support with keeping safety a priority

#### **GUIDELINES FOR CLASSROOM PARTIES / CELEBRATIONS**

If bringing food to your child's class such as drinks, cakes or pastries, the following guidelines should be used:

- Please notify the teacher and get their permission first.
- Immediately after cooking, if possible, items should be wrapped individually (i.e. cookies, muffins, cupcakes, etc.).
- The Chemung County Health department makes these additional requests:
   COLD FOODS SHOULD BE REFRIGERATED IMMEDIATLEY AND HELD BELOW 45 DEGREES FAHRENHEIT.

HANDS SHOULD BE WASHED BEFORE FOOD PREP AND THEN YOU SHOULD NOT TOUCH FOODS AFTER THEY ARE COOKED.

GLOVES, TONGS OR DELI PAPER SHOULD BE USED SO THERE IS NO BAREHANDED CONTACT WITH FOOD AFTER PREPARATION. Following the above practices will help to protect your children against food-borne illness.

**MEDICATION IN SCHOOL** - If a student needs any form of medication at school, a written physician's prescription and written parental consent are necessary. Any medication should be brought in the original container to the health office where it will be stored and dispensed. Please contact Mrs. White with further questions.

# **MARCH PROJECT FAIR**

<u>Project Fair 2018 - Thursday, March 15, 2018 5:30 – 6:30 PM</u>
\*Please see the grade level specific focus for your child's grade.
Projects are encouraged to be brought in the morning of Thursday,
March 15<sup>th</sup> and will need to be brought home the night of the Project
Fair <u>no earlier</u> than 6:20 PM. All others must be picked up on Friday,
March 16<sup>th</sup> by 8:15 AM.

### **GRADE PRE K – "RAINBOWS"**

Individually, students will create a rainbow. Students will use paints and paper. Students will create the project at school. Students will identify the different colors in a rainbow.

## **GRADE K – "FARM ANIMALS"**

Students will create a farm or zoo at home. Students may use a variety of materials to demonstrate their knowledge of the types of animals that live on a farm.

### **GRADE 1 – "SOUND AND RECYCLING"**

Students will create a project to display how vibration creates sounds. Students will use any recycled materials or household items. Students will complete the project at home. Students must include at least one sentence they wrote to describe what creates the sound.

## GRADE 2 - "COMMUNITY BUILDING"

Second graders will work independently or with the assistance of family members at home to choose a community building (a house, store, school, etc.) and create a model of the chosen building. This can be done in different ways using items you have at home, such as shoe boxes or cereal boxes. Crayons, markers, paint, magazine pictures, or any craft supplies can be used. Since we have been studying matter, students must include a chart listing the solids and liquids used to create their model.

## **GRADE 3 – "FAST CHANGES ON LAND"**

Independently, third graders will construct an exhibit or display of a fast change on land. Research choices include volcano, earthquake, landslide, hurricane, tornado, forest fire, tsunami, flood, or avalanche. Students must include the name of the fast change and label objects on the project. Students must include detailed descriptive sentences of possible destruction to the land.

## **GRADE 4 – "NEW YORK STATE PROJECT"**

Students will demonstrate their knowledge of a New York State topic. Independently, students will research and create an exhibit teaching others about a New York State topic. Students will construct a display focusing on a model of the physical characteristics of an animal native to New York State and/or its habitat, an aspect of traditional Haudenosaunee (Iroquois) daily life or culture, or a physical representation of the geography of New York State. Students will be able to use a variety of materials they have available to create their exhibit.







The Intermediate School will soon be completing 2018 -2019 classroom placements for students. We create class selections with the intent to achieve a mix of students by ability, gender, personality, and individual special needs. While we are unable to honor specific requests for teachers, we value your input from a parent's perspective. If you have specific information about your child's needs which should be taken into consideration or a specific previous personal experience, please put them in writing and send them to the Intermediate School by Friday, April 7th. Also, there will be a presentation for 4<sup>th</sup> grade families on Monday, March 26<sup>th</sup> at 6pm in the Middle School Cafeteria. A self-guided tour will follow. We look forward to working with you to ensure your child's academic success!
