Main Office Updates:

Friday, May 26th is Now a Regular Day in Session for ALL students:

Because the district has used four snow days this year, **Friday**, **May 26**, **will be a regular day in session for all students**. Last April, the Board of Education approved the one-page calendar that indicated our school schedule in the event we use more than three snow days. This calendar was sent home in our summer newsletters and is posted on our website. Please note: The multi-page calendar mailed to residents last summer has an error on May 26, and we apologize for that error. (The box for May 26 on that calendar should say "no school unless the district has used four snow days"). Again, Friday, May 26 will be a regular school day for all students. Highlighted in <u>our updated calendar</u> are the snow days we've used this year, and the schedule for snow days in the bottom right corner. Should there be additional snow days this year, we will follow that schedule. Thank you!

Lost and Found:

Our lost and found bin is full to the brim. Are you missing your child's lunch pal, clothes, toys or more? Check out the lost and found tables during May and June events at school. Also feel free to look through the bin which is located as you enter the building.

Spring Clothing:

With the warmer weather coming, we will be seeing many summer type outfits. Please remember to check with your child to make sure that the shorts and shirts they are choosing to wear meet the Code of Conduct requirements. Short shorts, spaghetti straps and crop tops are not permitted for school attire. If your child chooses to wear sandals, they need to have straps and he/she must be responsible for bringing sneakers for playground and gym. Flip-flops **are not** appropriate for school. Budget Vote/Board of Education Election: Tuesday, May 16th -7am-9pm @ Big Flats, Ridge Road, High School

- *Who is eligible to vote?* All district residents are eligible to vote, as long as they meet the following requirements:
- Are a U.S. citizen Have lived in the district for at least 30 days prior to the vote on May 17
- Are 18 years of age or older on the day of the vote -Please bring identification to the vote May 16
- Are not restricted from voting in general elections based on election law

15 Questions to Replace "How Was School Today?" | Edutopia

- 1. Tell me about a moment today when you felt excited about what you were learning.
- 2. Tell me about a moment in class when you felt confused.
- 3. Think about what you learned and did in school today. What's something you'd like to know more about? What's a question you have that came from your learning today?
- 4. Were there any moments today when you felt worried? When you felt scared?
- 5. Were there any times today when you felt disrespected by anyone? Tell me about those moments.
- 6. Were there times today when you felt that one of your classmates demonstrated care for you?_
- 7. Were there any moments today when you felt proud of yourself?
- 8. Tell me about a conversation you had with a classmate or friend that you enjoyed.
- 9. What was challenging about your day?
- 10. What do you appreciate about your day?
- 11. What did you learn about yourself today?
- 12. Is there anything that you'd like to talk about that I might be able to help you figure out?
- 13. Is there anything you're worried about?
- 14. What are you looking forward to tomorrow?
- 15. Is there a question you wish I'd ask you about your day?

The following can help your conversations be positive and powerful:

- Don't interrupt. This is a good rule for any conversation, but especially if you want to get a lot of information out of a kid.
- Ask for more. Simply say, "I'd love to hear more about that..." Or, "Can you expand on that a little?"
- Ask about feelings. After a child describes an experience, ask, "How did you feel in that moment? What did you notice about your feelings?"
- Validate feelings. Whatever your kid feels is normal and okay. Let them know that. Feelings are okay. Tell them this.
- Tell them it's not okay for teachers or kids to be unkind or mean. If they tell you a story about a teacher who yelled or disrespected them (regardless of what they said or did) let them know that it's not okay for an adult to treat them that way. Same goes for how they are treated by other children.
- **Thank them for sharing with you.** Always appreciate their honesty and willingness to share the highlights and bright spots, as well as the difficult moments. This will fuel their confidence in telling you more.

Be on the Hunt for Gold Shoes!

Each year the Hunt for the Gold Shoes event encourages the residents of Chemung County to step out of their homes and get involved with outdoor activities at local parks and other sites of interest. This acts to promote healthy lifestyles by encouraging residents to partake in out-door, physical activities. During this massive scavenger hunt beginning on May 1st, approximately 350 painted shoes will be hidden near hiking trails and in parks within our local community with the hopes of being found before June 10th.
