Dear Gardner Road Families -

Happy November to all our Gardner Road families. We are looking forward to a great month with many great experiences for our Golden Stars. Our 2<sup>nd</sup> grade students have been working hard in music preparing for the Veterans Day concert on the evening of November 13<sup>th</sup>. If you have a Veteran that would like to attend the concert, please return the flyer (see attachment – a paper copy was sent home too). Our students will participate in our second annual Story Path Trot on November 17<sup>th</sup> with a theme of construction at Gardner Road. The PTO will be hosting Bowling Night on the 17<sup>th</sup> – be on the lookout for more details. This month we look forward to our Career Day on November 29<sup>th</sup> – thank you to the Career Development Council for coordinating our volunteers. Towards the middle of the month, information will come home to our 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, and 4<sup>th</sup> graders about our annual Scripps Spelling Bee.

November is also time for parent-teacher conferences. Please see more information about this on page 2 of the newsletter. You should have received an email to sign up for a conference. If not, please reach out to your child's teacher.

Our morning drop-off and afternoon pick-up routines are going smoothly. Just a friendly reminder in the morning to pull all the way up to the star on the fence if no cars are in front of you. This allows for the greatest number of cars to unload at the same time. Also, if you drop-off around 7:40, please wait until our staff member opens the door and is outside to ensure student safety.

We love seeing all our Golden Stars every day. Attendance is important and we hope for 100% attendance for every student. We become very concerned if a student is absent as they are missing out on learning. We monitor attendance closely and become concerned if a student becomes at risk to being chronically absent. The risk category for becoming chronically absent is defined as 5% absence which equals a total of 9 absences for the whole year or one absence a month. If a habit of absenteeism is formed, it becomes very difficult to break for a student. If the student is well, please be sure they are in school.

# Gardner Road Main Office Updates:



### **Report Grades and Parent Teacher Conferences:**

Parent-teacher conferences are on the afternoons of November 17<sup>th</sup>, 21<sup>st</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>. We look forward to seeing all our parents visit their child's teacher to talk about their current and future learning. Just a friendly reminder that report cards are only distributed in 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grades this marking period. As you are meeting your child's teacher, please keep in mind what the 4,3,2,1 rating scale represents. If your child receives a '3' on the report card, that means they are currently meeting grade level expectations. A '4' would represent that your child is performing above grade level expectation. A '2' means that your child is working towards grade level expectation and a '1' represents that your child is struggling with the current grade level expectation.

#### **School Delays and Closings:**

The cold, slippery, white flakes are just around the corner. When the ice and snow arrive, it is often necessary to delay or close schools. The announcements can be found on our District website <a href="https://www.horseheadsdistrict.com">www.horseheadsdistrict.com</a> and the local media stations. In the event of a 1 or 2-hour delay, students can be dropped off at the cafeteria entrance beginning at the adjusted time. Please be aware that **NO** breakfast is served when there is a 2-hour delay. I will also post our status on the Gardner Road Twitter feed which can be found on the school website. Students will be going outside for recess as the weather becomes colder (20 degrees wind-chill and warmer). Please make sure that your child has a warm coat, a hat and gloves/mittens so they can stay warm as they play.





# What is the census?

The Horseheads Central School District regularly conducts a district-wide census. This year's census is especially important because the information we receive will assist us in developing elementary school boundary lines as we shift to three elementary schools - Big Flats, Gardner Road, and Ridge Road - at the start of the 2025-26 school year.

# Why is Center Street Elementary closing?

After careful consideration of the educational experience of our students and the state of our buildings, the district made the decision to move to three elementary schools. The community supported this plan with the passing of the referendum on December 7, 2021. As one of the oldest buildings in the district, Center Street would require significant construction to upgrade the building to current state standards for an educational space for students. The building is safe for students as it is now, but any additional construction would require asbestos and lead abatement, incurring significant costs that would not be completely covered through state aid. The plan approved by voters includes phasing out Center Street for student use, but keeping the building for district offices and community use.

# Which school will my child attend?

The district is working with a demographer to redraw the elementary school attendance boundary lines from four buildings to three. Your response on this census assists the demographer team with redrawing more balanced boundary lines that send students to the school closest to home when possible. A decision regarding the new boundary lines is expected by Summer 2024.




