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### ELECTRONIC DEVICE POLICY FOR REGENTS EXAMS

As a continuing effort to secure and maintain the integrity of State Exams including Regents exams, the Department of Education prohibits use of electronic devices during exam administration. Prohibited devices include, but are not limited to;

- Cell phones
- iPods/MP3 players
- iPads, tablets, and other eReaders
- Laptops, notebooks or any other personal computing devices
- Cameras or other photographic equipment
- Headphones, headsets, or in-ear headphones such as earbuds
- Any device capable of recording audio, photographic or video content, or capable of viewing or playing back such content.

We strongly encourage our students to refrain from bringing the above mentioned items to the exam sites. As a result, any student bringing a prohibited device to a testing site will have that device collected and secured while the exam is being administered. Additionally, the Department of Education has directed schools; "that any student who refuses to relinquish a prohibited device will be denied admission to their scheduled exam." Please note it is not the responsibility of Horseheads Central School District if a device may be damaged or lost.

### 2018-2019 SCHEDULING

Students will soon be meeting with their guidance counselors to select courses for the next school year. During this meeting each student will review their course and exam progress toward graduation. Counselors will discuss future plans and assist in selecting courses for the following year. Please note the following:

- These meetings are only to select courses. Schedules are built during the summer months and students will not receive a schedule until the first day of school in September.
- Students cannot request to have specific lunch periods, teachers, or course placement within a schedule.

Each student will have their course selection sheet mailed home after their scheduling meeting. Students will have the opportunity to change course selections but please be aware that there are strict deadlines to do so. Within the initial mailing home there will be a *course selection change sheet* included. If your student wants to make any changes prior to the last day of school (June 22<sup>nd</sup>), this half sheet of paper needs to be returned to the Guidance Office with the requested change indicated and a parent signature. After the last day of school through July 31<sup>st</sup> students can still make changes using a blue *Schedule Change Request* form which is available on the high school website and in the Guidance Office. <u>After July 31<sup>st</sup> no changes to course selections are allowed</u>. If there are conflicts with courses fitting into a student schedule, counselors will contact the student during the summer to discuss the conflict and alter the student's schedule. It is very important that parents make sure that their family contact information is updated with the school so that counselors are able to notify students of any problems with their schedules in a timely manner.

### **ATHLETIC INFORMATION**

Spring Season Parent Meeting will be held on Thursday, March 15, 2018 in the Horseheads High School Cafeteria at 6:00 p.m. This meeting is for all junior varsity/varsity sports. Individual modified team spring season parent meetings will be held at later dates. Parents if your 7<sup>th</sup> or 8<sup>th</sup> grade athlete is considering trying out for a spring JV/V sport, please see the spring 2018 timeline for dates. This information is listed on our district website under Athletics: APP (Athletic Placement Process).

Our 2018 spring sports season will begin Monday, March 5th for Varsity and JV. Online registration opens Saturday February 3rd. Family ID is the online system for sports registration. More details are on the district website under Athletics.

To be eligible for a spring sport, please ensure your student has had a physical on or after March 1, 2017 and that the school nurse has a copy so the athlete can be cleared medically. Once the student-athlete has been cleared by the Athletic and Medical Department the coach will receive notification.

Summer sports physicals are scheduled for Wednesday, June 27<sup>th</sup>, and Monday, July 2<sup>nd</sup>, from 8:00am to 12:00pm at the High School. Sign ups for physicals will begin mid May. If you are getting a physical with your Primary Medical Provider, please upload it to Family ID or submit it to the Health Office.

### Important information for parents of next year's seniors: Meningococcal vaccine(s) required by start of school year in September

Beginning September 1, 2017, all students entering 7<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grades in New York State must be fully vaccinated against meningococcal disease in order to attend school. **Students who are not up-to-date will not be allowed to attend school until they are vaccinated.**\*

### Parents, please note Before school this September:

- Your 12<sup>th</sup>-grader must have received two doses of the meningococcal vaccine unless he/she received the first dose after turning 16. Most students entering 12<sup>th</sup> grade got their first dose when they were younger and are now due for their second dose, or booster. This booster is needed because protection from the vaccine decreases over time.
- If your child had one or two doses of the meningococcal vaccine prior to his/her 16<sup>th</sup> birthday, he/she must have a second dose in order to begin school in September.\*

It's best to check with your doctor to see whether or not your child needs the vaccine. The vaccine may be given by your primary provider or the Chemung County Health Department. For information on how to get the vaccine at the Health Department and particular insurance coverage, call 737-2028.

#### About the Vaccine:

- It's not a new vaccine; it has been recommended for a decade.
- What's new is that the vaccine will be **required** for school entry as of September 1, 2017.
- Most parents already choose to vaccinate their children.

#### About Meningococcal Disease:

- It causes bacterial meningitis and other serious diseases.
- Teens and young adults are at greater risk.
- It comes on quickly and without warning.
- Its symptoms are similar to the flu.
- Every case of this disease can result in death or long-term disability.

\*Public Health Law requires that all students meet immunization requirements. Students transferring within New York State have 14 calendar days to submit required immunizations. Students transferring from out of state or out of country have 30 days to submit required immunizations.
