PHYSICALS

New York State law requires a health examination for all **new entrants** and students in **10th grade**. The physical must be completed by a New York State licensed physician, physician assistant or nurse practitioner. A physical dated on or after September 7, 2016 is acceptable. Our fax is 795-2510, email (<u>ctournour@horseheadsdistrict.com</u>), or bring to the Health Office.

Sport physical registration is May 1st - June 20th at noon. The registration process is through the Family ID program on-line via the Horseheads District Website under Athletics. The 2018 sports physicals are June 27th & July 2nd from 8 am –12 pm. Students will enter through the HS auditorium doors and proceed to the cafeteria area at their appointment time. A physical date is acceptable on or after 8/1/17 for a Fall 2018 sport.

Important information for parents of next year's seniors: Meningococcal vaccine(s) required by start of school year in September

Beginning September 1, 2017, all students entering 7th and 12th grades in New York State must be fully vaccinated against meningococcal disease in order to attend school. **Students who are not up-to-date will not be allowed to attend school until they are vaccinated.***

Parents, please note Before school this September:

- Your 12th-grader must have received **two doses of the meningococcal** vaccine unless he/she received the first dose after turning 16. Most students entering 12th grade got their first dose when they were younger and are now due for their second dose, or booster. This booster is needed because protection from the vaccine decreases over time.
- If your child had one or two doses of the meningococcal vaccine prior to his/her 16th birthday, he/she must have a second dose in order to begin school in September.*

It's best to check with your doctor to see whether or not your child needs the vaccine. The vaccine may be given by your primary provider or the Chemung County Health Department. For information on how to get the vaccine at the Health Department and particular insurance coverage, call 737-2028.

About the Vaccine:

- It's not a new vaccine; it has been recommended for a decade.
- What's new is that the vaccine will be required for school entry as of September 1, 2017.
- Most parents already choose to vaccinate their children.

About Meningococcal Disease:

- It causes bacterial meningitis and other serious diseases.
- Teens and young adults are at greater risk.
- It comes on quickly and without warning.
- Its symptoms are similar to the flu.
- Every case of this disease can result in death or long-term disability.

*Public Health Law requires that all students meet immunization requirements. Students transferring within New York State have 14 calendar days to submit required immunizations. Students transferring from out of state or out of country have 30 days to submit required immunizations.
