# **END OF YEAR INFORMATION, 2015-16**

#### Grades PreK-6:

- There will be no school Friday, June 17 for students in grades PreK-6.
- Monday and Tuesday, June 20 and 21, will be regular days in session.
- Wednesday, June 22, will be the last day of school for students in grades PreK-6 and will be a half-day. Dismissal will be at 11am.

#### Grades 7-8:

- Monday – Wednesday, June 20-22, will be half days for students in grades 7-8. Dismissal on June 20 and 21 will be at 11am. Dismissal on June 22 will be at noon (to accommodate dismissal of elementary students).

#### Grades 9-12:

# **NEWS FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE**

#### 10<sup>th</sup> Grade Physicals

New York State law requires a health examination for all students **entering 10th grade**. The examination must be completed by a New York State licensed physician, physician assistant, or nurse practitioner and must be within 12 months of entering 10<sup>th</sup> grade. (Any physical after September 7, 2015 would be accepted.) Sports & Physicals

Fall sports sign-ups will be from May 15<sup>th</sup> through August 10<sup>th</sup> at noon. The registration process will be through our new Family ID program on line via the athletic website. More details will be announced. The dates for sports physicals are July 21<sup>st</sup> and July 27<sup>th</sup> from 8am until 12pm. Sign-ups will also be through the same website. The deadline to sign up for a summer physical is July 6<sup>th</sup> at noon.

# **SCHOLASTIC ART AND WRITING AWARDS**

We are pleased to announce that senior **Madison Jurusik** has earned a National Medal in the 2016 Scholastic Art and Writing Awards presented by the Alliance for Young Artists and Writers. Her work was selected by creative professionals as the most accomplished in the nation. This year nearly 320,000 works of art and writing were submitted. Less than 1% were recognized at the national level. Students receiving top awards have been invited to attend a ceremony at the world famous Carnegie Hall on June 2<sup>nd</sup> and to participate in showcase events at Parsons School for Design at The New School and Pratt Institute's Pratt Manhattan Gallery in New York City. # <u>IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PARENTS OF NEXT YEAR'S SENIORS:</u> <u>MENINGOCOCCAL VACCINE(S) REQUIRED BY START OF SCHOOL YEAR</u> <u>IN SEPTEMBER</u>

Beginning September 1, 2016, all students entering 7<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grades in New York State must be fully vaccinated against meningococcal disease in order to attend school. **Students who are not up-to-date will not be allowed to attend school until they are vaccinated.**\*

# Parents, please note before school this September:

- Your 12<sup>th</sup>-grader must have received two doses of the meningococcal vaccine unless he/she received the first dose after turning 16. Most students entering 12<sup>th</sup> grade got their first dose when they were younger and are now due for their second dose, or booster. This booster is needed because protection from the vaccine decreases over time.
- If your child had one or two doses of the meningococcal vaccine prior to his/her 16<sup>th</sup> birthday, he/she must have a second dose in order to begin school in September.\*

It's best to check with your doctor to see whether or not your child needs the vaccine. The vaccine may be given by your primary provider or the Chemung County Health Department. For information on how to get the vaccine at the Health Department and particular insurance coverage, call 737-2028.

#### **About the Vaccine:**

- It's not a new vaccine: it has been recommended for a decade.
- What's new is that the vaccine will be **required** for school entry as of September 1, 2016.
- Most parents already choose to vaccinate their children.

#### **About Meningococcal Disease:**

- It causes bacterial meningitis and other serious diseases.
- Teens and young adults are at greater risk.
- · It comes on quickly and without warning.
- · Its symptoms are similar to the flu.
- Every case of this disease can result in death or long-term disability.

\*Public Health Law requires that all students meet immunization requirements. Students transferring within New York State have 14 calendar days to submit required immunizations. Students transferring from out of state or out of country have 30 days to submit required immunizations.

### **JUNE 2016 EXAMINATION SCHEDULE**

Please read and save this information for future reference regarding the June Examination Schedule for Classroom Final exams, Regents exams, Regents Competency Tests. Teachers will give students information about the examinations in each class. Please encourage your student(s) to prepare well for the examinations in order to successfully complete the second half of the school year.

This examination schedule will be in effect from **Tuesday**, **June 14 through Wednesday**, **June 22**, **2016**. During this period, students will only report to school for their examinations at the times scheduled below. All testing will be held in the North and South Wing of the High School. Students who must take the Regents Competency Tests will be given letters in homeroom with pertinent information about the date, time, and location of the examination.

Cafeteria services will be limited during the six-day examination period. The bus schedule will be maintained as if regular classes were in session. The North Cafeteria and the Library will be open for student use during the examination period.
