- Are a U.S. citizen
- Are 18 years of age or older on the day of the vote
- Have lived in the district for at least 30 days prior to the vote on May 16
- Are not restricted from voting in general elections based on election law
- Please bring identification to the vote May 16

# **10<sup>TH</sup> GRADE PHYSICALS**

New York State law requires a health examination for all students entering 10th grade. The examination must be completed by a New York State licensed physician, physician assistant, or nurse practitioner. A physical dated on or after September 8, 2016 is acceptable. ### **CALENDAR INFORMATION**

Because the district has used four snow days this year, **Friday, May 26**, will be a regular day in session for all students. Last April the Board of Education approved the one-page calendar that indicated our school schedule in the event we use more than three snow days. This calendar is posted on our website.

### **SPORTS & PHYSICALS**

Sports physical sign-ups are May 8<sup>th</sup> - July 12<sup>th</sup> at noon. The registration process will be through the Family ID program on line via the athletic website. The dates for sports physicals are July 19<sup>th</sup> & July 27<sup>th</sup> from 8 am –12 pm. Students will enter through the HS auditorium doors and proceed to the cafeteria area at their appointment time. A physical date is acceptable on or after August 1, 2016 for a Fall 2017 sport.

# **NO CHILD LEFT BEHIND NOTICE**

This notice is in compliance with provisions of the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 to inform you that, because your child's school received Title I federal funding, you have the right to request information regarding the professional qualifications of your child's classroom teachers. Specifically included is your right to know the following:

- Whether the teacher has met State qualifications and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction;

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PARENTS OF NEXT YEAR'S SENIORS: MENINGOCOCCAL VACCINE(S) REQUIRED BY START OF SCHOOL YEAR IN SEPTEMBER

Beginning September 1, 2017, all students entering 7<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grades in New York State must be fully vaccinated against meningococcal disease in order to attend school. **Students who are not up-to-date will not be allowed to attend school until they are** vaccinated.\*

# Parents, please note Before school this September:

- Your 12<sup>th</sup>-grader must have received **two doses of the meningococcal vaccine unless he/she received the first dose after turning 16.** Most students entering 12<sup>th</sup> grade got their first dose when they were younger and are now due for their second dose, or booster. This booster is needed because protection from the vaccine decreases over time.
- If your child had one or two doses of the meningococcal vaccine prior to his/her 16<sup>th</sup> birthday, he/she must have a second dose in order to begin school in September.\*

It's best to check with your doctor to see whether or not your child needs the vaccine. The vaccine may be given by your primary provider or the Chemung County Health Department. For information on how to get the vaccine at the Health Department and particular insurance coverage, call 737-2028.

### About the Vaccine:

- It's not a new vaccine; it has been recommended for a decade.
- What's new is that the vaccine will be **required** for school entry as of September 1, 2017.
- Most parents already choose to vaccinate their children.

### About Meningococcal Disease:

- It causes **bacterial meningitis** and other serious diseases.
- Teens and young adults are at greater risk.
- It comes on quickly and without warning.
- Its symptoms are similar to the flu.
- Every case of this disease can result in death or long-term disability.

\*Public Health Law requires that all students meet immunization requirements. Students transferring within New York State have 14 calendar days to submit required immunizations. Students transferring from out of state or out of country have 30 days to submit required immunizations.

Teachers will give students information about the examinations in each class. Please encourage your student(s) to prepare well for the examinations in order to successfully complete the second half of the school year.

This examination schedule will be in effect from **Tuesday**, **June 13 through Thursday**, **June 22, 2017**. During this period, students will only report to school for their examinations at the times scheduled below. All testing will be held in the North and South Wing of the High School. Students who must take the Regents Competency Tests will be given letters in homeroom with pertinent information about the date, time, and location of the examination.

Cafeteria services will be limited during the six-day examination period. The bus schedule will be maintained as if regular classes were in session. The North Cafeteria and the Library will be open for student use during the examination period.
