2023-24 BUDGET DEVELOPMENT

REMOTE LEARNING PLAN

The district is developing a remote learning plan as required by the state to be used in an emergency. This would be a plan we could call upon in emergency conditions such as adverse weather conditions, utility issues, or a communicable disease outbreak. This remote plan would allow the district to keep the calendar intact during years when winter weather is particularly challenging, or we face other reasons for school day closures. The state requires districts to post their remote plans and provide a means for parents/guardians to comment on the plan. As you know, we have used three of the four snow days built into our 2022-23 calendar. If the district must use more than one more snow day this year, this plan could be used to remain in session and therefore meet the state requirements for days of instruction.

CANVAS LEARNING MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

Throughout the fall semester, our district has been transitioning to a new Learning Management System (LMS) called Canvas. Canvas allows teachers to provide a personalized learning experience through instructional support, class calendars, messages, notifications, assignments, collaborative activities, and course resources in one platform. Parent/guardian Canvas accounts will allow you to view assignments, due dates, and calendars. These accounts will become active on Thursday, March 2. To access your Canvas parent/guardian account, you will need to use the same email you use for your Schooltool/Parent Portal login, and then set up a password for Canvas. UNIFIED BASKETBALL

Registration for Unified Basketball opens in Family ID on March 11th. The Unified Basketball season runs from April 3rd to June 9th. Athletes must have a physical that has been completed on or after April 1, 2022 and submitted to the Health Office to be eligible for this sport.

PARENTS OF CURRENT JUNIORS, PLEASE NOTE BEFORE SCHOOL THIS SEPTEMBER

Your 12th-grader must have received **two doses of the meningococcal vaccine unless he/she received the first dose after turning 16.** Most students entering 12th grade got their first dose when they were younger and are now due for their second dose or booster. This booster is needed because protection from the vaccine decreases over time.

If your child had one or two doses of the meningococcal vaccine prior to his/her 16th birthday, he/she **must have a second dose in order to begin school** in September.*

E-SPORTS NEWS

Horseheads Unified Raiders Esports Spring Season has started! Unified Sports® is a registered program of Special Olympics that combines equal numbers of athletes with and without intellectual disabilities on sports teams for training and competition. It is an educational and sports-based strategy that increases athletic and leadership opportunities and creates communities of acceptance for all students. There are three Mario Kart teams and one Rocket League team. Mario Kart is a racing game where teams of 4 students race to collect points for the team. Rocket League has teams of 3 using cars to play a soccer-like game and score goals against the opponent. Horseheads teams compete with teams across the US. Last Fall, the Mario Kart team of **Callum Bednarek, Michael Burt, Liam McInerney and Dylan Snellgrove** competed in the Championship game and came in second out of over 80 teams across the US! This Spring there are 21 students from the Middle School, High School and Phoenix Academy. For the first time, Mario Kart teams practice and compete from the school. Rocket League team members compete from home. The Spring season runs through the end of April.

THE BIG FIVE


