Over 130 educators and parents worked together to make recommendations and revise the standards, resulting in a new set of English Language Arts and Mathematics Learning Standards. Students are no longer expected to just memorize information and concepts: they

Students are no longer expected to just memorize information and concepts; they must now take their knowledge and apply, synthesize, or evaluate the correct approach to solving a problem. Your support at home all year long will help as students are challenged with higher level learning. The month of May and June will bring several exciting events for our students. Fifth grade students will be taking on their end of the year Adventure Based Learning (ABL) activities. PHYSICAL EDUCATION HAPPENINGS

Intermediate PE students have been very busy these last couple of months. They participated in and completed an intense session of Jump Roping and Juggling. They achieved levels they did not think were possible in both areas. We introduced iPad technology into the Jump Rope unit where students used the QR scanner to learn the different types of jumps. They really enjoyed using the technology and Mr. Hollar and I are looking into having students become the video examples and making our own QR scans or something similar.

Recently our students have completed the Track and Field and Badminton units. Several events were introduced including High Jump, Discus, and Relays. Students very much enjoyed getting to test their jumping and running skills! As for Badminton, classes participated in one-on-one Round-Robin games—even challenging Mr. Hollar and me! If the weather ever turns, we know there will be some eager students wanting to continue their Badminton play!

This spring our culminating fitness activity for our classes will be the "PACER," or "beep" test as the students call it. They participated in the fall in this test to achieve a baseline fitness score. Throughout the school year we have designed lessons to encourage students to apply necessary knowledge to better this score and their overall physical and mental health. The time frame for the "beep" test will be the middle to the end of May, giving our students the chance to hopefully enjoy better weather and increased activity!

We also have incredible news in regards to the Elks Hoop Shoot contest. Beginning back in November every PE class participated in the School-wide free throw contest. From there, the top twelve scores—three girls in the 10-11 age group, three boys in same age group and three each in the 12-13 age group—moved on to the Local contest at Horseheads High School. The top four shooters, one from each age group, then moved on to the Districts free throw finals in Penn Yan, NY; top finalists to the Regionals in Elmira and finally the State competition right here at the Horseheads Middle Intermediate Complex. Quite a journey to complete! One that our very own Intermediate Student, Emma Kamas, dominated placing second in the State Final! We are so proud of Emma and of the work she put into her free throw shooting skills!

All district residents are eligible to vote, as long as they meet the following requirements:

- Are a U.S. citizen
- Are 18 years of age or older on the day of the vote
- Have lived in the district for at least 30 days prior to the vote on May 15
- Are not restricted from voting in general elections based on election law
- Please bring identification to the vote May 15th.

NEW INFORMATION REGARDING VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS!

NEWS FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE



PLEASE READ THIS VERY IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

Dear Fifth Grade Parents/Guardians:

All 6th grade students will need to receive <u>2 doses</u> of the Varicella (Chicken Pox) vaccination along with the Tdap vaccine. The laws are very strict, and we cannot allow students to come to school after the first 10 days of school without these immunizations.

Your child may get the required immunization through your health care provider, Five Star Urgent or Walk-In Clinics or through the Chemung County Health Department, at (607)737-2028, appointment, only if qualified.

You must provide proof that your child has received the Tdap immunization in order for your child to attend school in the fall. Your health care provider or health department will provide you with this written proof once your child receives the immunization. Please bring this proof to our Health Office or fax it to us at 795-2495. Information must be received by <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>September 18</u>, <u>2018</u>. **No appointment cards accepted**.

<u>Please note:</u> 10-year-old students who are entering 6th grade will not be required to receive the Tdap vaccine at this time and will not be excluded from school, but will be tracked and must be immunized upon turning 11 years old.

If you have further questions, please contact the health office at 739-6366 (Option 2). Thank you for your cooperation.



It is that time of the year again to remember good health practices. Please keep your child home if he/she has had a temperature of 100 degrees or higher, vomiting or diarrhea in the past two hours. Because there is no known cure for the common cold, prevention is the key to keeping colds away. Most of the time you acquire a cold virus by touching your eyes, nose or mouth with an object that has the cold virus on it.

Therefore, to help avoid catching a cold:

- Wash hands thoroughly and frequently with warm soapy water.
- Sneeze into a tissue, rather than your hands, then discard the tissue(*Remember to please send in tissue boxes)
- Don't touch your face—your hands may have come in contact with a cold virus!
- Drink 8 glasses of water daily.
- Get plenty of rest—up to 12 hours a night!!!

Please be considerate of others—you are contagious for the first 3 days after symptoms appear.
