Extra! Extra! Read All About It!

- 1. Fall is well under way and temperatures are below freezing on some mornings. Physical Education classes and recess are outside when weather permits. Please be sure your child wears a coat and dresses appropriately for the weather.
- Friday, November 17th, is a Parent/Teacher Conference Day. The IS and all elementary schools are not in session on that day. Thursday, November 9th, is a half-day of school due to Parent/Teacher Conferences. **Dismissal will be at 11:00 AM this day.** Also, Friday, November 10th is Veteran's Day and all schools will be closed.
- 3. The School Store is open daily from 10:20 AM 12:45 PM. Middle School students operate the store. Pencils, erasers, paper and many other items are available there for students to purchase.
- 4. We use an electronic report card across the district. We will recognize students on the Honor Roll who have a grade point average of **85.0** or higher and do not fail any classes. Students achieving a grade point average (GPA) of 95.0 or above will be recognized as Distinguished Honors. A student will receive a <u>"U" for any grade under a 65</u>. A GPA will not be calculated if a student has a "U" on the report card. Art and Music classes are weighted 1/3 of the core subjects for the GPA because they meet twice in a six-day cycle.
- 5. Parent-Teacher Conference Forms were sent home. We encourage you to meet with your child's <u>homeroom teacher</u> to discuss their progress this year and ask questions. Focus for the conferences could be about academic, behavioral, and social strengths as well as areas for improvement.
- 6. <u>The Intermediate School staff gratefully declines Christmas gifts this Holiday Season</u>. Instead, we encourage you to help those in need or less fortunate by donating to your favorite charity. Applications for assistance from the Arctic League are available in the Health Office.
- 7. <u>Math Facts</u>—Memorization of math facts is critical for student success at this grade level. Math facts are essential for students as they study higher level math concepts. The Intermediate School would like to see ALL students testing at 100% on their math facts by the end of this school year. Your child may borrow a set of math facts cards. We ask that you or someone in your family help your child to study these math facts cards and then return them to their homeroom teachers. Practice will pay off!
- 8. We are encouraging our students to wash their hands often with soap and water. Hand sanitizer is available at the doors to the lunch room. We appreciate those who had sent some in with your child this year. We want to inform you that the District will be maintaining this during the year. Thank you.
- 9. PTO is planning a Luncheon for staff on Thursday, November 9th, Parent/Teacher Conference Day. Donations are appreciated. Please contact one of the PTO officers listed below with questions.

It's Back! INTRAMURALS

Parents – Starting after our Thanksgiving break our Intramural Fitness/Sports program will begin. The sign-up process is as follows:

ACADEMIC INTERVENTION SERVICES (AIS)

The New York State Education Department mandates that all schools identify and provide academic assistance to any student falling below designated cutoff on various а assessments. AIS stands for Academic Intervention Services. Identified students will be monitored and will receive additional help, which continues until the student demonstrates competency in the identified area. In many cases, a student will have been identified through a State Assessment he/she took at the end of the previous school year. In addition, students may qualify for AIS support if they have fallen below designated levels on District tests and/or have been recommended by teachers.

STUDENTS READ THREE BOOKS A MONTH

Our District has established the standard that Grade 5 and 6 students will read a minimum of 25 grade level books per year. We need your help to encourage your child to reach this goal each month. Children whose parents read with them on a regular basis are more successful in school.



School Spirit Days


MAKE A DIFFERENCE DAY

NEWS FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

PLEASE READ THIS VERY IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

Dear Fifth Grade Parents/Guardians:

All 6th grade students will need to receive <u>2 doses</u> of the Varicella (Chicken Pox) vaccination along with the Tdap vaccine. The laws are very strict, and we cannot allow students to come to school after the first 10 days of school without these immunizations.

Your child may get the required immunization through your health care provider, Five Star Urgent or Walk-In Clinics or through the Chemung County Health Department, at (607)737-2028, appointment, only if qualified.

You must provide proof that your child has received the Tdap immunization in order for your child to attend school in the fall. Your health care provider or health department will provide you with this written proof once your child receives the immunization. Please bring this proof to our Health Office or fax it to us at 795-2495. **No appointment cards accepted.**

<u>Please note:</u> 10-year-old students who are entering 6th grade will not be required to receive the Tdap vaccine at this time and will not be excluded from school, but will be tracked and must be immunized upon turning 11 years old.

If you have further questions, please contact the health office at 739-6366 (Option 2). Thank you for your cooperation.



It is that time of the year again to remember good health practices. Please keep your child home if he/she has had a temperature of 100 degrees or higher, vomiting or diarrhea in the past 24 hours. Because there is no known cure for the common code, prevention is the key to keeping colds away. Most of the time you acquire a cold virus by touching your eyes, nose or mouth with an object that has the cold virus on it. Therefore, to help avoid catching a cold:

- Wash hands thoroughly and frequently with warm soapy water.
- Sneeze into a tissue, rather than your hands, then discard the tissue(*Remember to please send in tissue boxes)
- Don't touch your face—your hands may have come in contact with a cold virus!
- Drink 8 glasses of water daily.
- Get plenty of rest—up to 12 hours a night!!!

Please be considerate of others—you are contagious for the first three days that cold symptoms appear.

- 4. Two winners from the *School Spelling Bee* will then continue to the *Local Spelling Bee* in Campbell, NY in March. They will be given a School Champion study list that will be used for the district level and following levels.
- 5. If a Horseheads Intermediate School Spelling participant wins, they will continue to the National Spelling Bee in Washington DC.

Horseheads Central School District Parents' Bill of Rights Relating to Student Data

The District, in compliance with Education Law 2-d, hereby establishes the following Parents' Bill of Rights in regard to student data:

- 1. A student's personally identifiable information will not be sold or released for any commercial purpose;
- Parents have the right to inspect and review the complete contents of their child's educational record. Procedures for reviewing student records can be found in the Board Policy entitled "Student Records," Policy 5500, Regulation 5500-R;
- 3. Security protocols regarding confidentiality of personally identifiable information are currently in place and the safeguards necessary to protect the confidentiality of student data are maintained at industry standards and best practices. The safeguards include but are not limited to encryption, firewalls, and password protection.
- 4. New York State maintains a complete list of all student data collected by the State and the data is available for public review at www.nysed.gov, or by writing to 89 Washington Avenue, Albany, NY 12234
- 5. Parents have the right to have complaints about possible breaches of student data addressed. Complaints should be directed to the Superintendent of Schools, One Raider Lane, Horseheads, NY 14845.
