- 1. The Intermediate School staff gratefully declines Christmas gifts this Holiday Season. Instead, we encourage you to help those in need or less fortunate by donating to your favorite charity. Applications for assistance from the Arctic League are available in the Office and were sent home with all students.
- 2. Students should NOT be dropped off in the morning along the road or while the car is in line to drop off. Drop off is at the curb in front of the Intermediate School Main Entrance door. Be sure to pull up as far as you can so that many students can be dropped off at a time. Thank you for adhering to this important safety procedure. Drop off time cannot be earlier than 7:40 AM.
- 3. Students should be picked up by 2:30 PM each day. There is not adequate supervision beyond that time.
- 4. A study has found that irregular bedtimes can lead to behavioral problems. Click here.
- 5. We will have a Canned Food Drive for our local Horseheads Food Pantry sometime in late winter or early spring when their supplies often run low.
- 6. Reminder that recess is outside when weather permits. Please be sure that your child wears an appropriate jacket.
- 7. Please be sure to pick your child up promptly from after-school activities including clubs and intramurals. Volunteers cannot stay late with students who are not picked up on time.
- 8. Report Cards: Grades for Art class and Music class are weighted at 0.33 because these classes meet two times in a six-day cycle. Our Honor Roll recognizes students who had a grade point average of 85.0 or higher and did not fail any classes. Distinguished Honors is 95.0 or higher. Congratulations to all Honor Roll students!
- **9.** We thank all the parents who participated in Parent Teacher Conferences in November. Communication with home is essential. Please contact your child's homeroom teacher to monitor your child's progress throughout the year or if you have any other questions. Parent Portal is always available as well.
- **10.** Please encourage your child to read at home. Our Goal is for all students to read three books each month in order to reach the goal of 25 books for the year.

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We are continuing to grow our Makerspace at the Intermediate School. A Makerspace is a place for students to tap their creativity and innovation by investigating/making things they are passionate about. We are starting small with things such as making challenges, electrical circuits, tech devices such as Makey Makey/Little Bits/Ozobots, and we even have a take apart station where students can deconstruct electrical devices to see how they work. 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HANDLING NON PA YMENT OF MEAL CHARGES

BOARD OF EDUCATION POLICY:

The Board of Education recognizes that on occasion, students may not have enough funds for a meal. To ensure that students do not go hungry, but also to promote responsible student behavior and minimize the fiscal burden to the District, the Board will allow students who do not have enough funds to "charge" the cost of meals to be paid back at a later date subject to the terms in this policy.

A student may charge up to ten reimbursable meals. The District may allow additional reimbursable meals to be charged when extenuating circumstances exist. Extra items such as à la carte items and snacks may not be charged.

No student with unpaid charges will be prohibited from purchasing food if they have money on a particular day.

PLEASE NOTE:

During the transition to PaySchools Central, the automatic notification of low funds on your child's school account has been disabled.
