# Extra! Extra! Read All About It!

- 1. Our Winter Music Concerts are right around the corner! This will be the first year we will host them at the Intermediate School in the IS Cafetorium. We are still in the process of working out final logistics, but the concert will likely begin at 7 PM. Please look for a communication from the Music Department regarding the time for your child to arrive. Seating and parking may be tight, so **please do not leave open seats in between families whenever possible.**
- 2. Applications for assistance from the Arctic League are available in the Main Office and were sent home with all students.
- **3.** Students should NOT be dropped off in the morning along the road or while the car is in line to drop off. Drop off is at the curb in front of the Intermediate School Main Entrance door. Be sure to pull up as far as you can so that many students can be dropped off at a time. Thank you for adhering to this important safety procedure. Drop off time cannot be earlier than 7:40 AM.

- 5. We will have a **Canned Food Drive** for our local Horseheads Food Pantry sometime in late winter or early spring when their supplies often run low.
- 6. Reminder that recess is outside when weather permits and temperatures are above 20 degrees F. Please be sure that your child wears an appropriate jacket.
- 7. We thank all the parents who participated in **Parent-Teacher Conferences** in November. Communication with home is essential. Please contact your child's homeroom teacher to monitor your child's progress throughout the year or if you have any other questions. Parent Portal is another great way to stay involved as well.
- **8.** Please encourage your child to **read at home**. Our goal is for all students to read three books each month in order to reach the 4K Book Challenge for the year.
- **9. Report Cards**: Grades for Art, Music, and PE are not weighted in the overall average. Our Honor Roll recognizes students on 3 tiers. Students who had a grade point average of 85.0 89.99 made Honor Roll, High Honors is 90.0 94.99, and Distinguished Honors is 95.0 or higher. Students cannot fail a class and still make the Honor Roll. Congratulations to all Honor Roll students!

#### **10. Digital Resources Family Questionnaire**

The New York State Education Department (NYSED) requires that districts send a Digital Resources Questionnaire to parents and guardians. This information is meant to assist the state and districts in providing resources to students and families. NYSED asks that parents/guardians complete a questionnaire for each student in grades K-12. You can access the questionnaire by logging in to the Parent Portal. HANDLING NON-PAYMENT OF MEAL CHARGES

#### **BOARD OF EDUCATION POLICY:**

The Board of Education recognizes that on occasion, students may not have enough funds for a meal. To ensure that students do not go hungry, but also to promote responsible student behavior and minimize the fiscal burden to the District, the Board will allow students who do not have enough funds to "charge" the cost of meals to be paid back at a later date subject to the terms in this Policy.

Further information is available in our Board of Education Policy Charging School Meals 8505. As a reminder, regular school lunches are free for the entire school year.
