Health Unit Notification

During the last marking period of each semester, seventh grade health classes will be studying the Human Physiology Unit. This is an abstinence-based unit which will include the male and female reproductive systems, conception and birth, the risks of teen pregnancy and sexually transmitted diseases, including HIV/AIDS and HIV/AIDS prevention.

You have the option of exempting your child from the HIV/AIDS prevention information. However, we strongly encourage your child to participate. HIV information must be presented to every child by State mandate. Therefore, it is the parent's responsibility to provide this information which will be included in the Health final. If a student is exempted, he/she is assigned to a study hall and required to do an independent study unit in health.




Mr. Steele (Technology Teacher), for creating the wooden candy cane holders for the countdown-to-break for our students. This is a new tradition every December!

Parents are informed of student progress in two ways. Progress reports are sent home with students at the five-week point of each marking period. A report card is sent home with students at the end of the tenweek marking period.

Progress Reports Will Reflect Actual Grade

Students will receive their actual grade, even if it is below 50, on their progress reports. Knowing their actual grade, rather than receiving our former "Actual Grade Below 50" comment, will help students and their families better understand the work required prior to the end of the marking period.

Attendance Auto-call and Email

To keep you updated regarding your child's attendance, the middle school will send you an auto-call and email when your student(s) are absent from school. If a student is absent from first period, a call and email will be generated and delivered in the morning. If the student continues to be absent, another call will be generated and delivered in the evening with all of the periods the student has missed.


Mrs. Schiefen, MS Reading Teacher "Ugly Sweater Contest"

Vincent Van Gogh was one of the most famous painters. He painted more than 900 panting in 10 years. Some of his most famous paintings were the Starry Night, Café Terrence at Night, Sunflowers, Almond Blossoms, Irises, and many more. In 1884 Vincent fell in love with his neighbor's daughter, Margot. He was so in love with her that he cut off his left ear and sent it to her. Vincent thought that if he did that then she would love him, but instead of Margot loving him she hated and feared Vincent, then after that Vincent decided to go to a nearby field and he shot himself in the chest. He did not die until 2 days later. Sadly, his younger brother Theo died and was buried right next to Vincent. Ozzy dropped out of school at the age of 15 and was sent to jail for robbery at the age of 17. After he was released, he joined local bands in England. One such band was Black Sabbath before going off on his own. Some of his well-known songs are "Crazy Train" and "No More Tears". Ozzy has 6 kids. He married his second wife, Sharon, who was his manager. They have lived in California for over 20 years. Many people remember when Ozzy bit the head off of what he thought was a rubber bat, but it was a real bat. No wonder he had the nickname "Prince of Darkness."



Horseheads Central School District Information about Emergency School Closings/Delays

Schools are closed when the weather makes it impossible to have reasonable attendance or when the schools or vehicles would not be able to operate safely. The school day is delayed when inclement weather conditions improve by early morning. Inclement weather may include snow, ice, and freezing temperatures. If the school day is delayed, buses will run and schools will open two hours later than the usual time.

The district announces school closings and delays in a variety of ways:

- Text messaging Parents/guardians can receive a text message if schools are closed or delayed by opting in to our text messaging service through SchoolMessenger. To opt in, text Y or Yes to 67587. You will receive a text response confirming that you are registered for texting.

Note: Television and radio stations also put closing/delay information on their websites.

Please do not call the radio/TV stations or the district's Transportation Office.

Important notes about school closings/delays:

- There may be a time when any of these means of communication do not work due to Internet or
 other issues, so we ask that you check more than one of our communication methods to determine if
 school is in regular session or not for that day.
- If schools are closed, they will remain closed all day for scheduled activities, including remedial programs, extra-curricular activities, use of facilities by non-school groups, and evening programs.
- When school is delayed, there is no supervision for students until schools open two hours later than
 the usual time, so parents should not drop their children off at school until they open. Additionally,
 on school delays, there is no breakfast served.
- On school delays, prekindergarten begins at 10:30am.
- If a storm develops after school begins, usual procedure is NOT to close school early. This allows
 time for highway crews to plow and sand the roads and has proved to be less disruptive and
 confusing than attempting to send students home early.

School/District Communication
