Outside Activity Time

The students at Ridge Road go outside for physical activity and socialization on a regular basis. As long as the temperature is above 20 and it is not raining, we try to get the students outside for a short time each day. Please make sure your child is dressed appropriately for the colder weather and snowy conditions. Gloves, hats, snow pants and boots should be sent in with your child on a daily basis.

Morning Drop Off-Student Dismissal

When visiting the school, please park in the **designated area in the back parking lot.** Parents who are walking their children into school, should park in the middle of the back lot and escort their children into the building. No child should ever be allowed to walk through the parking lot alone. <u>The lane next to the school is for a quick student</u> <u>drop-off only.</u> If you are just dropping your child off in the morning, please drive up the right lane next to the school and let your child out from the passenger side of the vehicle next to the back entrance steps. Please do not use this lane if you are parking and getting out of your car. Please also note that we have only **one lane for drop-off.** Please only drop your child off from the right lane next to the back entrance door. We do not want to have any children walking through traffic. The front circle is for busses only. For safety reasons, no one should be parking in or near the front circle. All students being dropped off for school or picked-up from school need to enter and exit the door to the school lobby from the back parking lot. Because of safety, we respectfully request that no parents park in the fire lanes next to the building at any time.

Parking for Large Events

United Environment and Energy, (The business across the street from our front circle on Ridge Road) has requested that we not use their parking lot. Please do not use this area as a parking spot during any of our Ridge Road events. Thanks so much for your support with this issue.

Classroom Instruction Time

Once the tardy bell has sounded and we have finished morning announcements at 8:15, instruction will be in session. Please try to have your children arrive at school by 8:00 each morning so they are in their classrooms and ready for class by 8:15. Unless already scheduled with the teacher, we respectfully request that parents not walk their children down the hallway once instruction has started. To not interrupt instruction, we ask that all visitors/parents come to the office to drop off any items that need to be delivered to the students or teachers.

Also, when picking up a child early for an appointment, please come directly to the office. We will notify the child's teacher and your child will meet you in the office.

Classroom School Supplies

Please touch base with your child during the Holiday Break and see if they need to replenish their school supplies for the upcoming second half of our school year.

Dear Community Members:

For the last few months, we've been talking about Horseheads 2030, a comprehensive project to improve both our educational program and physical infrastructure. We have now reached a time for action with our entire school district community, and we welcome all to become involved in order to help shape the future of our school district.

Our neighboring districts have undergone many major capital improvement projects in recent years, committing hundreds of millions of dollars towards their facilities. Horseheads, unfortunately, has only completed relatively small projects during the last decade. Our facilities are an important aspect of our educational programming if we are to continue being the district of choice for families moving into the area, and to keep our property values at the level they have been in past years.

Last December, you told us – by an overwhelming margin (84% voted NO) – that you want our district to stay the Horseheads Central School District. Last spring, the district determined the internal consolidation of schools would not yield major financial gains for the community and, therefore, finalized the green plan of no school closures at this time. Now we must consider moving forward in order to discuss what we want the Horseheads Central School District to look like, both educationally and physically, in the future. Therefore, we are developing a district initiative entitled:

We named the project Horseheads 2030 because this year's pre-kindergartners will graduate in the year 2030. Our efforts will not only benefit those students, but all students in our schools as we work to improve our district and educational programs. Horseheads has long been considered an excellent district for the quality of education we offer our students, but our facilities are aging. Our children and our community deserve facilities that keep up with the changing times and enhance the education we offer. Our athletic teams and community programs use our facilities, and they are in and out of the buildings extensively. Like in our schools, these facilities are showing significant wear and are not up-to-date. Many of the critical operating systems in our schools are original to the buildings and starting to fail. Many of our current classrooms are undersized and cannot seat all the students in a class. Our science rooms are small and not equipped for the latest in lab experiments. Additionally, today's technology landscape is entirely different, and our schools must keep up in order to allow our students to have the best education we can give them in today's global connectedness.

Our next step is to open the process up to our community. We need you to join the discussion in order to help us sort through district needs and wants for both our educational program and our facilities. There will be additional meetings in the coming months, but we hope you will come out and join us at the start as we work together to enhance our great district.

Thank you for your support of our students and their education. Thank you for giving your time to help us build on the excellence that is the Horseheads Central School District—for our students now, and our students of Horseheads 2030 and beyond!
