Outside Activity Time

The students at Ridge Road go outside for physical activity and socialization on a regular basis. As long as the temperature is above 20 and it is not raining, we try to get the students outside for a short time each day. Please make sure your child is dressed appropriately for the colder weather and snowy conditions. Gloves, hats, snow pants and boots should be sent in with your child on a daily basis.

Morning Drop Off-Student Dismissal

When visiting the school, please park in the **designated area in the back parking lot.** Parents who are walking their children into school, should park in the middle of the back lot and escort their children into the building. No child should ever be allowed to walk through the parking lot alone. **The lane next to the school is for a quick student drop-off only.** If you are just dropping your child off in the morning, please drive up the right lane next to the school and let your child out from the passenger side of the vehicle next to the back entrance steps. Please do not use this lane if you are parking and getting out of your car. Please also note that we have only **one lane for drop-off.** Please only drop your child off from the right lane next to the back entrance door. We do not want to have any children walking through traffic.

The front circle is for busses only. For safety reasons, no one should be parking in or near the front circle. All students being dropped off for school or picked-up from school need to enter and exit the door to the school lobby from the back parking lot. Because of safety, we respectfully request that no parents park in the fire lanes next to the building at any time.

Classroom Instruction Time

Once the tardy bell has sounded and we have finished morning announcements at 8:15, instruction will be in session. Please try to have your children arrive at school by 8:00 each morning so they are in their classrooms and ready for class by 8:15. Unless already scheduled with the teacher, we respectfully request that parents not walk their children down the hallway once instruction has started. To not interrupt instruction, we ask that all visitors/parents come to the office to drop off any items that need to be delivered to the students or teachers.

Also, when picking up a child early for an appointment, please come directly to the office. We will notify the child's teacher and your child will meet you in the office.

Classroom School Supplies

Please touch base with your child during the Holiday Break and see if they need to replenish their school supplies for the upcoming second half of our school year.
