The clothing sale is coming up and we will be working with Finger Lakes Design. All orders will be completed online and then we will hand out the merchandise when it is picked up. We will be preparing for some wonderful October fall events like our great costume parade at the end of the month.

We went over the Treasury Report, we are saving on storage due to being able to store things

at Mrs. Sotero's church and Katrina's building. We spent money on providing dinner for our volunteers during the Fall Festival. We would like to build in refreshments for our volunteers who come in the late afternoon and work well past their dinner time. We will have this established in our future budgets. This is something that we think shows we appreciate their help.

We discussed purchasing a counter clicker to keep track of how many people are attending our PTO School events.

New Business:

Other events coming up were discussed.

Make a Difference Day is being planned for Sat., Oct. 28th. CS will be collecting food and items for local animal shelter. The CS Student Council will be leading a community project of making tie blankets. We are looking for volunteers to assist with delivering the animal supplies. The HH School District will be using our school buses to deliver the food times to the food bank and to the animal shelters.

Veteran's day breakfast and refreshments are built into the budget. This year, we are rebuilding after covid and with so many of our former participants not able to attend due to health and / or relocation, we anticipate it will be a smaller group than we had prior to covid. We moved the time so that our Pre-K students will be able to join in the event and therefore need to shorten the celebration due to lunch preparations. We will need volunteers to assist with the breakfast refreshments.

The Holiday food baskets are going to be taken care of by Mrs. Bennett, Mrs. Scibek and Mrs. Sotero again this year.

Jamie Dauphinet will be leading the Holiday Shoppe again this year. Mrs. Sotero will be sharing the schedule so that we can begin to encourage volunteers for this special event. Since we had so many parents who volunteered for our fall book fair, we will be reaching out to them too.

We will need a coordinator for March Madness. Fun Run - Pam Callahan will get back to us to see if she is able be in charge of the Fun Run.

Spring Carnival – now Carnival (since it is scheduled again in June). We discussed bringing back the option of holding basket raffles again.

For future book fairs such as the BOGO Book Fair -we discussed the need to request 2 registers because we met the minimum at the fall festival. We are also going to add a makeup day after the last day scheduled for grade levels. We will need to do a refresh book order during the fair so our children have more of a choice for new books. In addition, a flyer will be sent home the day prior to the make-up day letting parents know and then another flyer will be sent home regarding the options of shopping online even after the book fair has physically ended at our school.
