Update from Mrs. Hinman:

The end of the school year is quickly approaching! New York State regulations require all medication left at school at the end of the school year be discarded. This includes inhalers and Epi-pens. Unless your child has current permission to self-carry their medication, the school is not able to allow your child to bring the medication home themselves. If you need to make special arrangements to pick up medication, please call to make arrangements. **Medications not picked up, will be disposed of Friday, June 28th @ 11:30 am.**

Warm Weather Outfits and Shoes:

With the warmer weather here, we will be seeing many summer-type outfits. Please remember to check with your child to make sure that the shorts and shirts they are choosing to wear meet the Code of Conduct requirements. Short shorts, spaghetti straps, and crop tops are not permitted for school attire. If your child chooses to wear sandals, they need to have straps on the ankle, and they must be responsible for bringing sneakers for playground and physical education. **Flip-flops and slides are not safe for school.** Thank you for your support with this.

Parents/guardians must complete a form for every student.

If you plan to drive your student(s) to/from school, use another means of transportation, or have a student that participates in a fall athletic sport, please <u>do not</u> 'reserve' a spot in the event your child needs busing later in the year. If you need busing for your student(s) after the start of the school year, you will be able to begin busing at any time. We request a 48-hour notice to adjust bus runs.

My Student(s) Does Need Busing

- You will need your student's ID (Your student's ID can be found on a report card, <u>SchoolTool</u>, <u>PaySchools</u>, or you may call your school's main office to request it via email)
- Submit morning and afternoon pick up information (addresses)
- Select the day(s) of the week your child will need busing
- If your child has transportation needs identified as part of their IEP, you do not need to complete this
 form. Student Services and Transportation will work together to coordinator these services and contact
 you closer to the start of school
- Submit any additional comments

How to Talk About Mental Health With Children

Families have a powerful role in supporting their children's mental and emotional health at home and at school. Learn signs that your child might be struggling and strategies to talk about mental health with your child.

Signs to Look For

Look for these warning signs that your child might need support:

- Feeling very sad or withdrawn;
- · Harming or planning to harm themselves;
- Getting into fights;
- Not eating, throwing up, or using laxatives to lose weight;
- Having intense worries or fears that get in the way of daily activities;
- Having difficulty controlling behavior;
- Using drugs or alcohol;
- Having severe mood swings; or
- Exhibiting a drop in grades.

Starting Conversations

Try leading with these questions and actively listening to your child's responses:

- Can you tell me more about what is happening? How are you feeling?
- Have you had feelings like this in the past?
- Sometimes you need to talk to an adult about your feelings. I'm here to listen. How can I help you feel better?
- Do you feel like you want to talk to someone else about your problem?

When talking about mental health problems with your child:



- Communicate in a straightforward manner;
- Speak at a level that is appropriate to a child or adolescent's age and development level;
- Discuss the topic when your child feels safe and comfortable;
- Watch for reactions during the discussion and slow down or back up if your child becomes confused or looks upset; and
- Listen openly and let your child tell you about their feelings and worries.

School Connectedness

When families are engaged in their children's school activities and initiatives, children get better grades, choose healthier behaviors, and have better social skills.

Here are three ways to support your child's mental health and emotional well-being in school and at home:

- 1. Get involved in health decisions at school.
- 2. Communicate with your school, letting them know how they can help support your child.
- 3. Try strategies at home like asking about your child's feelings, focusing on their strengths, and modeling positive coping skills to manage stress, like going for a walk.
