- 1. Our Winter Music Concerts are back on for this year! With the need to space out more for a layer of extra precaution, we will be performing in two waves. - 2. The Intermediate School staff gratefully declines Christmas gifts this Holiday Season. Instead, we encourage you to help those in need or less fortunate by donating to your favorite charity. Applications for assistance from the Arctic League are available in the Office and were sent home with all students.
- **3.** Students should NOT be dropped off in the morning along the road or while the car is in line to drop off. Drop off is at the curb in front of the Intermediate School Main Entrance door. - **9. Report Cards**: Grades for Art, Music, and PE are not weighted in the overall average. Our Honor Roll recognizes students on 3 tiers. Students who had a grade point average of 85.0 89.99 made Honor Roll, High Honors is 90.0 94.99, and Distinguished Honors is 95.0 or higher. Students cannot fail a class and still make the honor roll. Congratulations to all honor roll students!

## Who is eligible to vote?

All district residents are eligible to vote (both renters and homeowners), as long as they meet the following requirements:

- · Are a U.S. citizen
- Are 18 years of age or older on the day of the vote
- Have lived in the district for at least 30 days prior to the vote on December 7
- Are not restricted from voting in general elections based on election law

Please note: You do not have to be registered in general elections or own property in order to vote.


