INFORMATION REGARDING VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS!



PLEASE READ THIS VERY IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

Dear Sixth Grade Parent/Guardian,

All children must receive the immunizations required by New York State Law Section 2164 to attend school. You are receiving this letter because your child will require additional immunizations to enter 6th grade. All 6th grade students must receive a booster dose of the **Tdap immunization**.

The Tdap immunization is for tetanus, diphtheria, and acellular pertussis (whooping cough). This requirement has been in place since 2016.

You must provide proof of immunization. The required immunizations can be obtained from your primary care provider (PCP)/pediatrician.

In limited circumstances immunizations may also be obtained from the Chemung County Health Department. For more information on requirements contact the health department at: (607) 737-2488.

The immunization must be given no earlier than 10 years of age and no later than 11 years of age.

Student Age	When is proof of immunization required?
grade	Proof of immunization must be received within 14 calendar days of the start of school (by September 17, 2025), or your child will be unable to attend school until proof of immunization is received.
grade	Proof of immunization must be received within 14 calendar days of turning 11 years old and will be tracked accordingly.

Acceptable forms of proof of immunization (documentation) include:

An electronic health record from your provider's office, an immunization certificate signed or stamped by your health care provider, a record issued by NYSIIS or CIR, an official immunization registry from another state or foreign country if applicable.


NEW PROCEDURE AUTOMATED ATTENDANCE EMAILS

Dear Intermediate School Parents/Guardians,

The Intermediate School wishes to keep parents/guardians informed of students' attendance at school and assist students in meeting attendance requirements. To this end, we have been mailing letters to parents/guardians when their student is absent from school for eight days or more. At the end of last school year, this process changed to automated emails. Emails are sent to parents/guardians of students who are absent from school 8, 16, 24, or more times. This change will allow for quicker and more efficient delivery of important information regarding your student's attendance.

As a reminder, regular school attendance is crucial for your students' academic success and overall well-being. Consistent attendance ensures that students do not miss out on valuable instruction, opportunities, and important classroom activities. Our Attendance Policy is designed to promote a positive and engaging learning environment for all students. It is essential that your student attends school regularly and arrives on time. In the event of an absence, please notify the school as soon as possible, please remember that an excused absence still counts towards the student's absence count. Character Trait: Citizenship

• Involvement in the community: Citizenship also means your relationship with the community in which you are a member. In other words, your behavior and actions. It's not just following the rights and behaviors laid down by the law; it also means adhering to the social and moral behavior expected of a citizen.

The Habit of Mind:

Metacognition: Thinking About Thinking Metacognition is the understanding and awareness of one's own mental or cognitive processes.

There are many possible examples of metacognition. These examples may help to gain a better understanding of the concept. Below are some examples of metacognition:

- 1. A person learns about his or her own style of learning.
- 2. A person learns about what things help him or her to remember facts, names and events.
- 3. A person becomes aware of his or her own biases in judging others.
- 4. A person learns about what strategies are the most effective in solving certain problems.
