Extra! Extra! Read All About It!

Staff at the Horseheads Intermediate School would like to welcome you to our school. We look forward to a great year! The staff is charged with the responsibility of ensuring the welfare and safety of your children from the time of their arrival at school in the morning, until they are placed aboard the school buses at dismissal. In order to fulfill this responsibility, we solicit your cooperation with the requests below.

- 1. If you would like your child to be excused from school early, please send a note stating the time of dismissal, the name of the person to whom the child is to be released, and the reason for the early dismissal. Students will remain in their classroom until you arrive unless you call ahead to say you are on the way.
- 2. School begins at 8:25 AM. Homeroom period starts at 8:00 AM. Students who do not ride the bus to school should not arrive before 7:40 AM. No supervision will be provided prior to 7:40 AM. From 7:40 AM until 8:00 AM, students will be directed to the Cafeteria. Breakfast will be available from 7:40 AM 8:25 AM. To avoid any potential unsafe situations, it is requested the stipulated arrival time be followed. This is a reminder:

 Parent Drop-Off will only be at the Main Entrance of our school. Please drive up and around the outside of the upper parking lot and proceed to drop off in the canopy area at the Main Entrance of the Intermediate School. Please make sure your child is ready to exit the curbside of your vehicle. Morning buses will use the Fieldhouse entrance to drop-off students to school. No parent vehicles will be allowed to use the Fieldhouse entrance. This is for safety and to minimize traffic congestion at the school and on Sing Sing Road.
- 3. If your child is not going to ride home on the school bus on a given day, send a note on that day to the school office outlining your pick-up plans. Children should be picked up promptly between 2:20 2:30 PM according to the procedures previously sent out. Adults picking up students will be asked to sign a dismissal sheet before leaving with the children. Please park in the front of the building in the upper lot and use the side doors (door 26 for 5th grade and door 21 for 6th grade). Please do not arrive before 2:20 PM. Recess is held on the blacktop of the upper parking lot until this time and classes do not end until 2:15 PM.
- 4. Students who have notes for early dismissal or for other dismissal arrangements are to take a note to **their homeroom teacher in the morning.** Without a note, your child will be placed on his/her regular bus or pickup based on the regular procedures.
- 5. On the first day of school, several papers need to be read and signed. One very important notice is the EMERGENCY GO HOME form. Please be sure that your child is aware of the emergency address in the event of an early dismissal. Be sure to alert us to any changes that may occur throughout the school year in order for the changes to be made here at school
- 6. Should any questions or concerns arise during the school year, we would ask that you contact your child's teacher first, per school district policy. Further questions can be directed to the building administrators.

7. Please note an important message from the Transportation Department. If you should have any questions, please feel free to call us at 739-6366.

"In an effort to cut costs and increase efficiency, we have consolidated some of our bus runs. As a result, your child's bus number(s) and bus times may change, and your child may be on the bus a little longer than last year. In addition, due to limited space on the buses, we are no longer able to allow friends of students to ride their bus to and from school with them."

- 8. FREE SCHOOL MEALS All students can receive a free breakfast and lunch through the National School Lunch Program Seamless Summer Option each school day in the 2021-2022 school year ensuring they are fueled and ready to learn.
- 9. Important Open House Information. Our Annual Open House is scheduled for **Tuesday, September 14th**, between 6:30 PM 7:30 PM. This is always a great evening. The evening is structured as a traditional style of Open House. Parents are welcome to travel around and meet all teachers anytime between 6:30 7:30 PM. Please note that this structure will allow parents to briefly meet each teacher and learn valuable information about the school year. If you wish to spend more time with the teacher, please set up a conference for another time. We ask that only parents/guardians and students attend to limit the number of visitors. We apologize, but extended family members should not attend this event. All guests will be required to wear a mask while indoors.

Absences due to vacation trips are not excused absences. Before making vacation plans, please consult the school calendar. Parents are strongly discouraged from taking their children out of school for family vacations because valuable classroom instructional time can never be replaced by make-up assignments. If parents decide to take their child out of school for vacations, please notify your child's teacher.

Because such extended absences are not excused, students are expected to request their work **upon return**. You may ask ahead of time for work, but homework may change based on how students are learning the content. An appropriate time frame will be given to return the assignments. Students should be encouraged by parents to practice academic skills while on the trip (i.e. journaling, applying math to situations, finding science/historical connections, etc.)

Advanced Art classes will be offered to fifth and sixth grade students who show skills and demonstrate accelerated levels. These classes allow for students to engage in higher level projects during an extra Art time. Some of the criteria for the program selection are: 1) The student consistently demonstrates excellence in art skills, technique and creative problem solving with a variety of art forms and materials; 2) The student completes quality Art assignments; and 3) The student consistently exhibits self-motivation, interest in pursuing Art outside of the classroom, and considers pursuing Art as a possible future career.

*Students need to be successful in their classroom studies to be available during this time for extra art instruction.

Initially, each student's ability level will be assessed through a Composite Drawing Test, their beginning art projects and recommendations from elementary Art teachers.

Parents of those students accepted will be notified and asked to sign a permission slip. Class attendance is mandatory for participating students. Please understand that space is limited, with only two classes of Advanced Art available for each grade level. Students who were previously in Advanced Art are not automatically guaranteed a spot for this school year. ALL students will be assessed on a continuous basis and can join the program throughout the year.



VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR SCHOOL CAREER EVENTS

The school district has many career related events including career days, career panels, job shadows, classroom speakers, field trips, and mock interviews. INFORMATION REGARDING VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS!



NEWS FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

Dear Fifth Grade Parents/Guardians:

In order to be in compliance with NYS immunization requirements, all 6th grade students* must receive a booster dose of the Tdap immunization. The Tdap immunization is a tetanus, diphtheria and acellular pertussis immunization. It is a tetanus booster that also adds protection for pertussis (whooping cough). This vaccine is not a new vaccine and has been required for school attendance since September 1, 2016.

To meet the requirement, this Tdap vaccine must be given no earlier than 10 years of age and no later than 11 years of age. For 6th grade students who are 11 years old, proof of this vaccine must be received within 14 calendar days of the start of school. **Information must** be received by September 21, 2021, or your child will be unable to attend school starting on September 22, 2021, until paperwork has been brought in with the documented Tdap being given. You must provide proof that your child has received the Tdap immunization for your child to attend school in the fall. Acceptable forms of documentation include an Immunization certificate signed or stamped by your health care provider or an electronic health record copy from your health care provider's office. You may email this to scamachocipolla@horseheadsdistrict.com, fax to our Office at 607-795-2495 or drop it off to the Intermediate School.

Your child may receive the required immunization through your health care provider or through the Chemung County Health Department. For more information, please call (607) 737-2028 #2 for an appointment.

NYS Department of Health effective September 2, 2016 requires all 7th and 12th grade students have a meningococcal vaccine.

*Please note: 10-year old students who are entering 6th grade will not be required to receive this vaccine at this time. They must receive this vaccine no later than 14 days after turning 11-years old and will be tracked accordingly.

It is that time of the year again to remember good health practices. Please keep your child home if he/she has had a temperature of 100 degrees or higher, vomiting or diarrhea in the past two hours. Because there is no known cure for the common cold, prevention is the key to keeping colds away. Most of the time you acquire a cold virus by touching your eyes, nose or mouth with an object that has the cold virus on it.

Therefore, to help avoid catching a cold:

- Wash hands thoroughly and frequently with warm soapy water.
- Sneeze into a tissue, rather than your hands, then discard the tissue(*Remember to please send in tissue boxes)
- Don't touch your face—your hands may have come in contact with a cold virus!
- Drink 8 glasses of water daily.
- Get plenty of rest—up to 12 hours a night!!!

Please be considerate of others—you are contagious for the first 3 days after symptoms appear.

Information about Emergency School Closings/Delays

Schools are closed when the weather makes it impossible to have reasonable attendance or when the schools or vehicles would not be able to operate safely. The school day is delayed when inclement weather conditions improve by early morning. Inclement weather may include snow, ice, and freezing temperatures. If the school day is delayed, buses will run, and schools will open two hours later than the usual time.

The District announces school closings and delays in a variety of ways:

- **Text messaging (effective February 2019)** Parents/guardians can receive a text message if schools are closed or delayed by opting into our text messaging service through School Messenger. To opt in, text Y or Yes to 67587. You will receive a text response confirming that you are registered for texting.

- Local television and radio stations:

Note: Television and radio stations also put closing/delay information on their websites.

Please do not call the radio/TV stations or the district's Transportation Office.

Important notes about school closings/delays:

- There may be a time when any of these means of communication do not work due to Internet issues, etc., so we ask that you check more than one of our communication methods to determine if school is in regular session or not for that day.
- If schools are closed, they will remain closed all day for scheduled activities, including remedial programs, extra-curricular activities, use of facilities by non-school groups, and evening programs.
- When school is delayed, there is no supervision for students until schools open two hours later than the usual time, so parents should not drop their children off at school until they open. Additionally, on school delays, there is no breakfast served.
- On school delays, Pre-Kindergarten begins at 10:30 am.
- If a storm develops after school begins, usual procedure is NOT to close school early. This allows time for highway crews to plow and sand the roads and has proved to be less disruptive and confusing than attempting to send students home early.

PARENTS' BILL OF RIGHTS FOR DATA PRIVACY AND SECURITY

The parent/guardian or eligible student has a right to:

- 1. Inspect and review the student's education records;
- 2. Request that records be amended to ensure that they are not inaccurate, misleading, or otherwise in violation of the student's privacy rights;
- Consent to disclosure of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education
 records, except to the extent that the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) authorizes
 disclosure without consent; and
- 4. File a complaint with the United States Department of Education alleging failure of the district to comply with FERPA and its regulations. Complaints may be sent to Family Policy Compliance Office, U.S. Department of Education, 600 Independence Avenue SW, Washington, DC 20202-4605.
