

# The "Fish" monger's Philosophy

What's a fishmonger, you ask? A person who sells fish of course! In 1930s Seattle, Washington, a fish-market stall opened at the Pike Place Market. The Pike Place Fish Company served its customers well for decades. When former employee, now owner, John Yokoyama, began to stir the pot, he found a better way for his employees to enjoy their job. The self-proclaimed World Famous Pike Place Fish Market became known as the place where the fishmongers threw fish — literally! The fishmongers put on a show that the customers loved. They would throw whole fish across their stall, sometimes to the customer. Each transaction became a positive, uplifting experience for everyone. The fish market became one of Seattle's top tourist attractions. How did this happen? Fish Philosophy, of course.

The workers there found that four basic principles were their key to success:


Be there in the moment (for their customers)




Be sure to use Parent Portal to help you keep track of your student's grades. Visit the district website or contact the guidance office if you need to sign up.

# **Honor Roll**

Students who earn an average of 85-89.99 will be placed on the Honor Roll; 90-94.99 will be placed on the High Honor Roll; 95-100 will be placed on the Distinguished High Honor Roll. We distribute Honor Roll Certificates to students during 10th period at the end of each marking period.

# **Quality Parties**

Students qualify for 10<sup>th</sup> Period Quality Parties by meeting the following criteria:

- Being a quality student (see below)
- Maintaining an average of 70 or above
- Having no disciplinary referrals
- Maintains regular school attendance

### A Quality Student at Horseheads Middle School is:

- Prepared for class, on time and ready to learn
- Completes all homework, class work and class projects to the best of their ability
- Knows and understands school policies and procedures and accepts the direction of teachers, school officials and others who have been assigned the responsibility to enforce them

# **Health Information**

- All 7th-grade students are required to have a physical dated September 8, 2021 or later.
- An Emergency Contact Form will be sent out the first week of classes. Please remember to sign and return this form.
- Vision and hearing screenings will be conducted in the health office for all 7th-grade students, unless provided by a private physician.
- We encourage self-carry medication orders for inhalers and EpiPens.
- Inhalers and EpiPens are the only medications that a student is allowed to carry. They must be carried by the student and not put in their locker.
- Physician's order can be obtained to have other medications available in the health office for students to use as prescribed. Examples include pain relievers and cough drops.
- Routine medication requires a physician's order and parent signature each school year.
- All medications **must be delivered** to and picked up from the Health Office by a **parent**.

New York State now requires all incoming 7th-grade students receive one dose of the Meningococ-cal Vaccine prior to entering the 7th-grade school year. Your child will not be able to attend school beginning 9/20/22 without proof of immunization. If you are new to the district, a copy of your student's immunization record is required within 14 days of entry.

Students enrolled in a high school credit-bearing course must be in attendance 85% of the scheduled class periods. Students lose credit on the 29th absence in a course that meets every day all year.

### **Cell Phones and Electronics**


Students are required to turn off personal cell phones and other electronic devices when they enter the building. Students may receive permission from the main office to use a cell phone to communicate with a parent or guardian during the school day. Teachers may also grant permission to use cell phones for educational purposes in their classroom. Unauthorized use of a cell phone will result in disciplinary action per our cell phone procedures.

# **Middle School Award Programs**

We believe that students should be honored for their academic accomplishments, as well as their commitment to following the Raider Way. We offer several awards and recognition for student achievement.

#### **Honor Roll**

Students qualify for the Honor Roll by meeting the criteria outlined below:

95-100	Distinguished High Honor Roll
90-94.99	High Honor Roll
85-89.99	Honor Roll

Honor Roll certificates are distributed during 10th period following each marking period. Students who fail one or more classes are not eligible for the Honor Roll.

### **National Junior Honor Society (NJHS)**

Students meeting the initial screening criteria will be invited to apply for the National Junior Honor Society. The criteria is listed below:

- 1. Students must achieve an average of 90% or higher in all of the following subjects:
  - English
  - Foreign Language
  - Math
  - Science
  - Social Studies
- 2. Students must demonstrate the following characteristics:
  - Create enthusiasm for scholarship
  - Stimulate a desire to render service
  - Promote leadership
  - Encourage responsible citizenship
  - Develop and maintain good character

Once students receive their invitation to apply, they must complete an online application and attend an informational meeting. Applicants are then reviewed by the NJHS faculty selection committee. Successful candidates will receive an acceptance letter and invitation to the ceremony in late May. Students will remain members of the NJHS as long as they continue to uphold the high standards of the society.

#### 8th Grade Awards

- 1. President's Award for Educational Excellence
  - Students must maintain an average of 90% or higher in math, English, science, social studies and foreign language over the course of seven marking periods at the middle school.
- 3. Highest Average Award
- 4. Triple C Award
  - Each 8th-grade team nominates a student who they feel best meets the criteria of commitment, character and courage. These students are honored with a certificate from the Attorney General of New York State.
- 4. Art Award
  - Middle School art teachers select two students who demonstrate excellence in the area of art. Students will have their artwork framed and displayed at the middle school.

## **Drop Off and Pick Up**

We are currently working to improve our —pick-up and dropoff procedures. Please look for more details in our summer newsletter coming out soon.

Due to the volume of students being dropped off and picked up, the line can become very long. We ask that you help alleviate unnecessary wait time by following these simple procedures:

- Utilize the entire drop-off lane. Please do not wait until you have pulled up to the entrance to drop off your students. Approximately 10 cars can drop off and pick up students simultaneously. Please stay in line. Do not drop students off or pick them up in the staff and visitor parking lot.
- Students should exit the vehicle as soon as it is safely stopped. Please be sure students have all of their belongings ready to go.
  - Do not drop students off on Sing Sing road.
- Students should be walking in the door no later than 7:40 so they can be in 1<sup>st</sup> period by the 7:45 tardy bell. Students with three tardies to 1st period may be assigned a detention.
