

Happy October Everyone!



Early Dismissal Practice Drill

On **Thursday, October 6th**, all K-4th grade students will participate in a drill at 2:00 pm to practice for an emergency early dismissal. Please note that this drill will take about 15 minutes. All students will board the busses that are marked for their emergency dismissal. The bus drivers will take a quick headcount for the number of students designated to be on that emergency bus. As soon as the count is finished, all the students will exit these busses and go back to their classrooms before starting the regular dismissal. (**No students will be sent home on the emergency bus.**)

All K- 4th grade students will dismiss for their normal end of the day routine at 2:25. **<u>No one will be allowed in the building during the drill from</u> <u>about 2:00-2:20.</u> We will open the doors for parents to come in for dismissal as soon as the drill has been completed.

Because of the practice drill- Pre-K students will be dismissed at 1:40 on Thursday.



<u>No School for Students – Friday, October 7th and</u> <u>Monday, October 10th</u>

School will not be in session on Friday, October 7th for students, as all staff will be participating in trainings and meetings for the Superintendent's Conference Day. Also, on Monday, October 10th, all Horseheads Schools will be closed in honor of Columbus Day.

Halloween Parade

Our Halloween Parade will start at **1:15 on Friday, October 28th. If it is not raining, parents may attend the outside part of our parade.** Please know that no parents will be allowed in the school building. You will need to park in the back lot and walk around the school to the front lawn. Parents are invited to stand along the front of the school from the flagpole area down toward the art room and up toward the primary playground. We will have the students start inside at 1:15 and they will go through the school to pick-up each class and go out the door near the south end of the building. It will be around 1:20 before they start outside the building. The students will walk along the front of the school and re-enter the building at the north end.

Please make sure that your child's costume is appropriate for our very young students to see and that it does not have any type of toy weapon as a prop. We plan to run a normal morning schedule that is focused on academics. Please do not allow your child to come to school dressed in costume or with make-up on. All students will have an opportunity to change into their costumes prior to the parade.

We want to make sure dismissal will be safe and go smoothly, we respectfully ask that all students follow their normal dismissal procedures for the 28th and that parents do not request to pick them up early.

All Ridge Road students and family members are welcome to join us back at school on Friday evening for the Halloween Dance. This is always one of the favorite events for the students. Parents are also welcomed to dress in costume and join the kiddos on the dance floor!

I G NATIONAL SUMMIT ON K-12 SCHOOL SAFETY AND SECURITY

The National Summit on K-12 School Safety and Security, hosted by the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA), brings federal, state, and local school leaders together to share actionable recommendations that enhance safe and supportive learning environments in kindergarten through grade 12 (K-12) schools.

The Summit, held virtually over three days in November, will consist of a two-hour session centered around the themes of **violence prevention** (Day 1); **cybersecurity and online safety** (Day 2); and **physical security** (Day 3).

PHISHING

Phishing is a cybercrime in which a target is contacted by email, telephone or text message by trying to trick the target into providing sensitive data such as personally identifiable information, banking and credit card details, and passwords. The information is then used to access important accounts and can result in identity theft and financial loss.

BUSINESS EMAIL COMPROMISE (BEC)

Business email compromise (BEC) is a growing type of email cyber crime scam where the attacker uses an account that has been compromised at a company to send fraudulent requests for payment to be made to the attackers bank accounts. These attacks are difficult to detect and prevent because they seem to come from legitimate, trusted sources.

RANSOMWARE

Ransomware is a type of malicious software, or malware, that prevents you from accessing your computer files, systems, or networks and demands you pay a ransom for their return. Ransomware attacks can cause costly disruptions to operations and the loss of critical information and data.

OUR TOP TIPS FOR AVOIDING THESE EXPLOITS


- 1. <u>Be skeptical</u> of any emails or phone calls that you receive asking for certain kinds of information. <u>Be more skeptical</u> of email inquiries that you didn't initiate or request.
- 2. <u>Be suspicious</u> of any requests that seem to require you act immediately.
- 3. <u>Be wary</u> of any attachments from sources that you don't know or that you didn't request.
- 4. Even if you know the source, you may want to <u>call and verify</u> that something is legitimate before you act on it. <u>Take your time.</u> Don't be caught in one of these traps. Ask for Help from IT.

To be kind online you need to be aware of your own actions and learn how to make safe and comfortable areas for yourself and others online.


