On Sept. 27, 2024, Horseheads High School alumni and coaches were recognized during the 2024 Athletic Hall of Fame induction ceremony.

Those being inducted include the following:

- Rick Gryska, Class of 1995 Rick excelled in both football and baseball. In football, he was a standout quarterback with impressive stats and accolades: All-Twin Tiers selections, Ernie Davis Award nominations, and key contributions to Horseheads' first Section 4 championship in 1994. His baseball career was equally stellar, highlighted by a 11-1 senior season, crucial wins in state semifinals, and multiple all-league honors. Named Horseheads High School Male Athlete of the Year in 1995, Rick later made significant impacts as a coach across various sports, leading teams to sectional titles and demonstrating his enduring commitment to athletics.
- Chris Honness, Coach Chris was a dedicated teacher and coach at Horseheads. Chris made a significant impact across multiple sports. As head coach of varsity wrestling from 1987-94, he led his teams to four STC titles, including three consecutive championships from 1992 to 1994. In varsity lacrosse, he guided the team to its first-ever Section 4 Class A title in 1987. Honness also contributed as an assistant varsity soccer coach and a modified soccer coach. Throughout his career, he was a committed physical education teacher, shaping and inspiring students both on and off the field.

- Shanetha McLaurin, Class of 2006 Shanetha excelled in both softball and volleyball. In softball, she was recognized as a STAC Metro/West all-conference player as a junior and a STAC West all-division selection as a senior. In volleyball, McLaurin was a STAC West second-team honoree in 2005 and played a crucial role in leading her team to the state finals that year and the state semifinals as a junior. Her impressive high school career continued with four seasons at Syracuse University, showcasing her talent and dedication.
- Rob Phillips, Class of 2000 Rob was a versatile athlete with notable achievements in baseball, football, and wrestling. In baseball, he earned STAC West all-star honors and played a crucial role in Horseheads' 1999 state championship, scoring both runs in the Class A state final. On the football field, Phillips was a two-time All-Twin Tiers selection, with standout performances including multiple touchdowns and key plays as both a runner and receiver. In wrestling, he was a STAC West all-star and a two-time Section 4 Class A champion. His diverse talents and contributions made him a standout athlete across multiple sports.
- **Doug Wiley, Class of 1965** Doug was a standout athlete with an illustrious basketball career, earning First Team All-Twin Tiers honors twice and leading in scoring both in the city and the Twin Tiers during the 1963-64 and 1964-65 seasons. A finalist for Basketball Player of the Year in both years, he led his team to two STC League Championships and a remarkable 18-1 record in his senior year. Additionally, Wiley was a consistent performer in track and field and baseball, earning three letters in each sport. His legacy as a versatile and dominant athlete remains unmatched.
